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Dr. Laarman is an Assistant Professor of Dairy Nutrition and Physiology at the University of Alberta, where he started in 2019. Dr. Laarman received his BSc and MSc from the University of Alberta, and his PhD from the University of Guelph. In 2015, Dr. Laarman started a position as assistant professor of Ruminant Nutrition at the University of Idaho, focusing on health and nutrition of pre-weaned calves as well as dietary transitions. At the University of Alberta, Dr. Laarman's research focuses on gut development, especially absorption of immunoglobulins and nutrients in calves, as well as gut adaptation to new diets in calves and cows, with the goal of improving health and nutrient absorption in dairy animals.
